

Health Enterprises & Aging Care




The Greater Louisville region is comprised of 15 counties across Kentucky and Southern Indiana. It is home to more than 1.5 million people and over 83,000 businesses. The region's central location affords it the logistical advantage of being within a day's drive of two-thirds of the U.S. population.

Additionally, the Greater Louisville region is a relatively inexpensive place to live with a ranking of 96.8 on the cost

of living index scale. Kentucky and Indiana rank 92.4 and 95.5 respectively on the scale.

The health enterprises and aging care industries represent 5.3% of total employment in the Kentucky-Indiana bi-state area. The Greater Louisville Region is comprised of 3,017 health enterprises and aging care businesses that employ over 46,000 people. From 2018-2024, the health enterprises and aging care industries in Greater Louisville grew by 1.8%.

The Health Enterprises Network (HEN) leads, organizes and facilitates region-wide economic growth in the health care sector through a theme-based approach to programming


and initiatives. HEN is an investor-led organization of thought leaders that aim to provide meaningful and measurable results for the region's health care sector through the following methods:
